Mentoring is a vital pillar in our state's youth development

Kinder-Ready: Are they ready for school?

We connect youth with mentors as early as age 6 to begin fostering a positive adult relationship.

Language & Literacy: Can they read and write?

Our mentors are the valued-added building blocks to ensure third graders are reading proficiently increasing their capacity to graduate.

Critical Thinking: Can they solve the problems?

We use an individualized development plan for each mentee, which is supported by their mentors, family and our staff to increase growth mindset, problem-solving, communication and conflict resolution.

Youth Connectedness: Who matters to them?

Mentors foster trust and relational healing. If potential goes unfulfilled, there is a direct correlation to poverty, unemployment and incarceration.

College or Job Training Ready: Are they ready?


With no mentor, students from the families we serve are 10 times more likely to drop out of high school than their high-income peers. High school dropouts are ineligible for 90 percent of jobs and make up 80 percent of the prison population.

Career Pathway: Can they find a promising career?

Social capital is a central factor to closing the opportunity gap. Our mentors level the playing field by extending their networks and connecting youth to internships, apprentice programs and employment.

Mentoring Supports Academic Achievement

72% increase in math and English

90% of youth more likely to graduate high school



Increased average daily attendance to school districts



Reduces Risky Behaviors & Criminal Justice Involvement

85% of children and youth reported maintained or improved attitudes toward avoiding risky behaviors, including drugs or alcohol, skipping school, and smoking

63x Incarceration rates were 63 times higher for high school dropouts than for college graduates



... and Delivers Cost Savings

\$250 daily cost for a youth in juvenile hall

\$315,000 MORE

These higher incomes will deliver additional tax revenue, higher consumer spending and increased charitable giving and volunteerism.
